At Shiloh Veterinary Hospital we want to ensure your pet's safety and well-being while undergoing anesthesia/surgery. A veterinarian will perform a physical exam before sedating your pet, however, many disorders of the kidneys, liver, heart, and blood can't be detected without blood tests and a heart electrocardiogram (ECG).

We strongly recommend performing pre-anesthesia blood testing in all healthy patients under 7 years of age, and require pre-anesthesia blood testing in all patients 7 years of age and older. We will also place an IV catheter and fluids which help with blood pressure, maintains hydration and allows quicker IV access in an emergency situation. We feel this is necessary to perform the safest procedure in our older patients.

If your pet is under 7 years of age (required in 7 or older), would you like pre-anesthesia blood work performed? **Yes/No**

An ECG is always recommended when a patient is undergoing anesthesia. Would you like this done? **Yes/No**

If your pet is 7 years of age or older, we offer two options in blood work prior to anesthesia. A regular presurgical blood profile evaluates liver and kidney enzymes, blood sugar, total protein and a complete blood count (red cells, white cells, and platelets). **Yes/No**

A more comprehensive screening profile checks complete chemistry, blood sugar, electrolytes, protein, lipids, pancreas, CBC and thyroid level. **Yes/No**

Laser surgery is another option we offer your pet. This technology reduces trauma to your pet, improves recovery, and often shortens hospital stays. There is less pain, less bleeding, and less swelling with laser surgery. The laser is mandatory for declaws. **I would like laser surgery Yes/No**

Almost all procedures and surgeries do incur some amount of pain. All pets will be given a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory medication prior to anesthesia and then oral medication will be sent home.

Orthopedic procedures, declaws, and extensive abdominal surgery can require more intensive pain medication, and for these types of surgeries we require a fentanyl patch. The patch provides 72 hours of continuous narcotic pain relief and helps aid in recovery and relief of post-op pain.

Please ask if you have any questions or concern about the appropriate pain medication for your pet.
